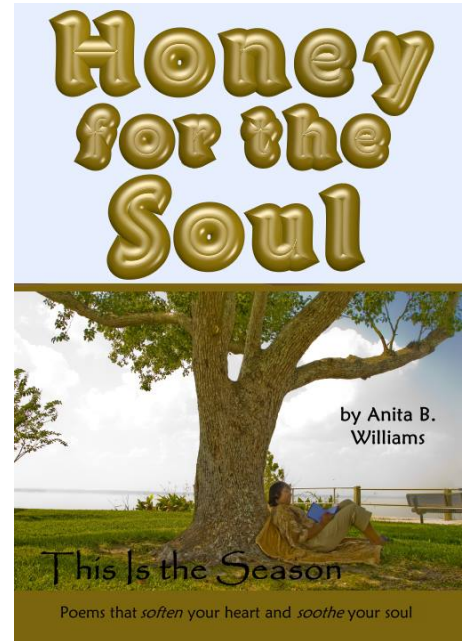

## ★★★★★ Christian Comfort and Inspiration

*I found (or perhaps it found me) Honey for the Soul: Poems that Soften Your Heart and Soothe Your Soul at precisely a time in my life when I needed it most. Billed as "a true testament of God's timing and season for everything in our lives," Honey for the Soul provides comfort when you are hurting and hope when you feel all is lost. It is also interspersed with relevant Bible verses so it can be used as a devotional. The book is broken into five sections as follows:*

*I. This Is the Season urges readers to forsake this world and find strength and encouragement in God: "Just keep soaring ... Keep believing ... Keep searching ... Keep hoping in the things of God."*

*II. All in the Name of Love assures readers that there is peace in God's love when earthly love fails: "Leave the cares of the world behind" and "God's love will fill this place." It reminds the readers that real love "is a reflection of God's love." It also encourages one not to fear loving: "Do not be afraid to open your heart."*

*III. Never Alone drives home the point that God is always by your side, no matter how lonely you feel: "God is always with you ... And he feels your pain of loneliness." Physically, no one may care, but spiritually Jesus always cares: "Jesus is with you every step of the way."*

*IV. When You Believe emphasizes that believing in Christ is all we need to get through even life's harshest trials. It stresses that one should find his or her worth through Christ Jesus, not the world.*

*V. He Is the Reason proclaims that Christ is not only the reason for the Christmas season but also the reason our sins are wiped clean and why we are a living testimony to Him: "Mighty God ... Will make a way out of no way ... When hope seems lost ... He is the ray of light."*

*If Honey for the Soul has one weakness, it is that some of it has been seen and done before. For instance, "Joseph, Did You Know?" is merely a retelling of the famous "Mary, Did You Know?" holiday song. Nevertheless, those who are experiencing difficulties in their life will find much Christian comfort and inspiration within this poetry collection's pages.*
